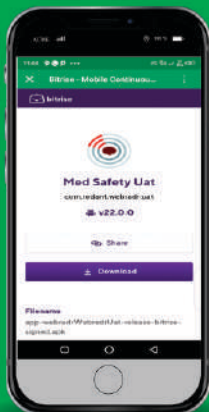


## Why Use the Med Safety Mobile App?

The Mobile App grants users instant access to medicine safety information. By reporting adverse reactions through the App users help make medicines safe for all.

# How do I get the App?

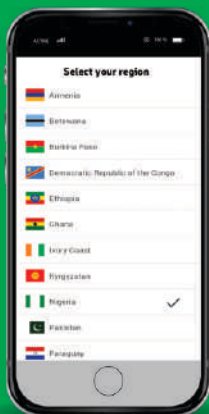
1. Search App Store of Google Play for Med Safety



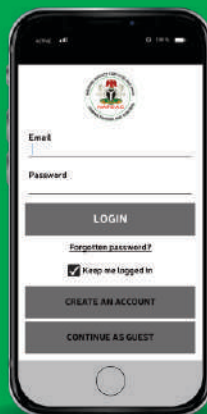
2. Install the App to your device

## What happens after you submit a report to NAFDAC?

Reports sent by users are received at the National Pharmacovigilance Centre of National Agency for Food and Drug Administration and Control (NAFDAC). The reports are then evaluated by a committee of experts to identify potential risks associated with the medicinal products. Appropriate regulatory actions are taken based on identified risks. This action helps to ensure that medicinal products on the Nigeria market are safe for all.
